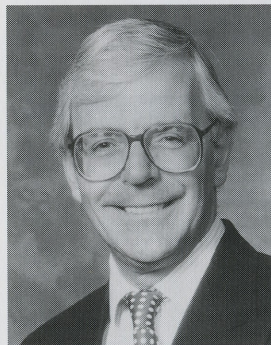


**IAN WILMUT****Tuesday, 8:00pm

DECEMBER 1, 1998**

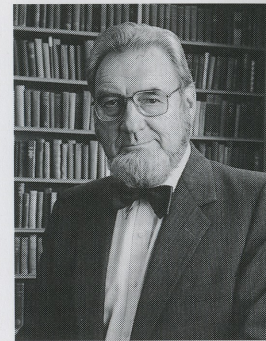

JANUARY 12, 1999**

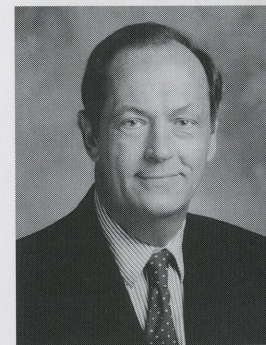

FEBRUARY 16, 1999**

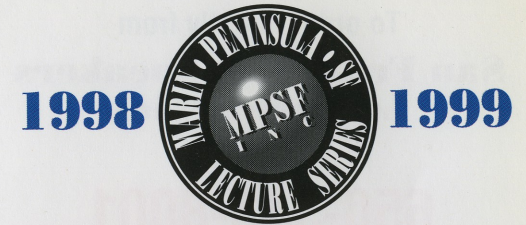
