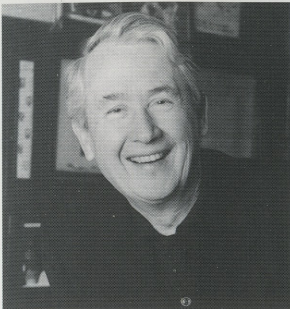

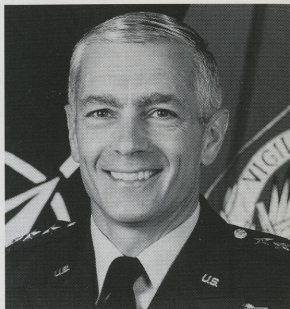


Frank McCourt

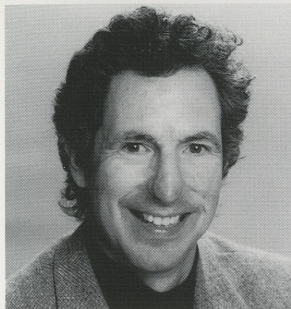


Wesley Clark

George Mitchell

MARCH 14, 2001

Democratic Senator from Maine (1980-1995) and Senate majority leader, (1989-1995). In 1996 he was invited by the British and Irish governments to serve as Chairman and Chief Negotiator, Peace Negotiations in Northern Ireland. He was nominated for the Nobel Peace prize in 1998. Author, *Making Peace*.
