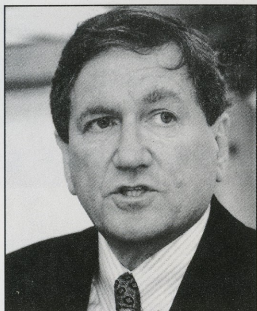


HENRY HUGH SHELTON

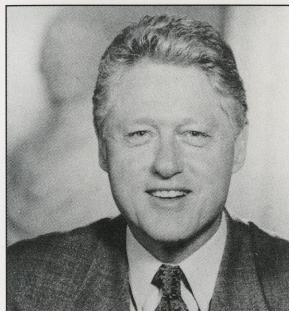

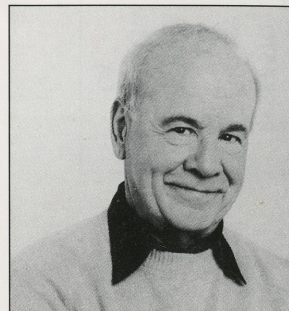
